Hello everyone,

The speaker, Allen Mizdail, with the History and Collection of Vintage Buttons has been rescheduled for April of 2022. He will have been on three of our bookmarks by then.

Our March meeting is the annual guild awards and the President's Challenge month. The Nursery Theme is to be a minimum size of 36" X 36".

In April we have a program and workshop scheduled with Brenda Jeschke. The program on April 6 is "Tips and Techniques (What the Books Don't Always Tell you)" and the workshop on Saturday is "Only Two Blocks." She teaches how to make a stunning quilt with only two blocks.

This workshop consists of using only two simple quilt blocks. First you will cut the block pieces, then piece the blocks, and the fun begins. Your will be given five layouts to choose from or you may choose to create a new quilt layout. You will learn the process and then complete the quilt top at your leisure after the class.



Quilters Say What!?

The quilting world has a language of its own filled with technical jargon, quirky nicknames and acronyms that are downright hilarious! If you are new around here, you might feel a little lost. Take this passage, for example.

"Well friends, I just found two more UFOs in the corner of my sewing room. If I can't locate a matching FQB, I won't be able to make enough HSTs to finish them off. These PIGS may turn out to be a real WOMBAT!"

Confused? Here's a translation:

"Well friends, I just found two more UNFINISHED OBJECTS in the corner of my sewing room. If I can't locate a matching FAT QUARTER BUNDLE, I won't be able to make enough HALF-SQURE TRIANGLES to finish them off. These PROJECTS IN GROCERY SACKS may turn out to be a real WASTE OF MONEY, BATTING AND TIME!"

Let's look at a few more examples to help build your quilting language fluency: Over a lifetime, a truly avid quilter may need to plan several FARTs (fabric acquisition road trips) in order to build sufficient 401F (fabric for retirement).

Some non-quilters may question this practice, claiming all those FARTs could cause a real SABLE (stash accumulation beyond life expectancy.) Quilters generally dismiss those concerns as utter nonsense.

Some quilters may suffer from FOB (fear of binding), which, left untreated, could result in a severe case of PhD (projects half-done).

However, those same quilters are usually quite prone to self-diagnose HIPS (Hundreds of Ideas Piling Skyward) as the true cause. As such, they prefer the term WIP (work in progress) to PhD because, obviously, they're totally going to finish all this quilts... someday.

Let's be real. Some days, I CRAFT (can't remember a flipping thing) Where did I set my scissors? Did I really just sew another block on sideways? WWIT (What was I thinking)?

Today I spent half the day in a fog stitching (seam ripping: rip it, rip it)! I swear, one more mistake like this, and the entire project is destined to be a TOAD (trashed object abandoned in disgust)!

Now that you are familiar with several key terms, you are ready to chat it up with all your quiltiest friends! Here's to loads of FARTs and nary a TOAD!

Sack Lunch Ministry

The demand for the church's sack lunches has grown tremendously, with the church now giving away about 35 lunches a week to the homeless or the hungry. The following is the list of items for the sack lunch ministry operated by our facility location host, First Presbyterian Church. Just pack the lunches in a small brown paper sack with non-perishable items, such as:



- canned tuna or chicken salad
- peanut butter and crackers
- cheese and crackers
- chips
- fruit cup
- cookies
- pudding

You may also include a drink (although not necessary) as well as a napkin and spoon. Items should not require a can opener. <u>Bottled water is also much appreciated.</u> You can find many of these items at a Dollar Tree, Big Lots, Wal-Mart, etc.

The church also collects pancake mix and syrup. We also have a tip jar at the sign-in table, and if everyone were to throw in their loose change we could donate a great deal to the church each month. Thank you so much!




